Linas Linkevičius


Former Minister of Foreign Affairs of Lithuania

Linas Linkevicius served as Lithuania's Minister of Foreign Affairs from 2012 to 2020, Before, Ambassador Linkevicius served as the Lithuanian Permanent Representative to NATO from 2005 until 2011.

Prior to this, he was elected as a Member of Seimas (Parliament) (1992-1996). In 1993, he was promoted to Minister of National Defence of Lithuania, a post which he held from 1993-1996. He was then appointed as the Ambassador and Head of Mission of Lithuania to NATO and the WEU. From 2000-2004, Ambassador Linkevicius was appointed again as Minister of National Defence of Lithuania. He was the Ambassador for Special Missions at the Lithuanian Ministry of Foreign Affairs (2004-2005).

In 2012, he was the Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the Republic of Lithuania to the Republic of Belarus.

Givi Gigitashvili


Digital researcher at the Atlantic Council's DFD Lab

Alice Stollmeyer


Founder and Executive Director of Defend Democracy


Cyber security expert


